#### **Contractor ID cards**

All contractors have been provided with cards with a contractor number on it. Please, if a contractor comes to do work on your unit ask for them to show this card and their photo ID. If they are unable to provide you with both you can decline them from entering your property; or if you want to check the number against our records please call 0800 624 456 to check that it is the correct person at your unit.

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#### **Hazard Identification Boards**

Where there is a vacant unit requiring work to be completed on it, you will start to see hazard identification boards appear in the windows of the units. This means that contractors will be on site during the following 2-3 weeks completing work ready for the next tenants to move in.

#### **A NEW HOME FOR HOUSES**

At OCHT we are not just finding homes for people - we found a new permanent home for houses in need.

Louisson Place in Opawa is the new home for 8 units moved by OCHT from the Linwood Park temporary housing village. There are two 4 bedroom and six 2 bedroom units which will very soon be home to a number of families.









The units were removed on the back of trucks late at night to minimise disruption to traffic.

We will be beautifying the space with landscaping, fencing, decking and other improvements to ensure the development fits into its surrounds and meets tenant needs.

This is the first development for OCHT since we took over management of the social housing portfolio from Christchurch City Council. We will keep you informed of more new developments to come in 2019.

#### **BBQS AND MORNING TEAS**

We have started these up again with 22 planned before Christmas and another 30 in the new year. Wet weather has been challenging, but we have rescheduled dates to ensure all complexes who have not received a BBQ or morning tea since OCHT started in 2016, will see us during this summer period. We are very fortunate to have representatives from organisations such as CDHB, Neighbourhood Support, Pegasus Health and CEA attend these BBQs and connect with people in need of their services or help.

We see these as great opportunities for you to socialise with your neighbours, meet some new people and for us to hear your ideas.

#### WARM & WELL PROJECT 2018



The Warm & Well Project was developed from tenant feedback in the 2017 Tenant Satisfaction Survey that identified concerns relating to condensation build up and could, droughty units.

We acknowledge that some of the older housing stock does not have modern fixtures to reduce condensation build up and retain heat effectively or may not be able to have insulation installed due to building design. These matters are being discussed with Council. However, we wanted to take some action to help improve situations for affected tenants.

Age Concern and Anthony Harper lawyers kindly donated funds to allow the Trust to purchase scoopys, door snakes and rolls of bubble wrap to be distributed free of charge to tenants most affected.

From April – October 2018 OCHT staff visited 65 of the 104 complexes offering scoopys, door snakes and bubble wrap for those keen to have this on their windows.

A total of 325 scoopys and 250 door snakes were provided to tenants and over 30 tenants received bubble wrap on their unit windows.

The busiest months were June, July, August.

We continue to deliver scoopys and bubble wrap on request.

#### **KEEPING SAFE THIS HOLIDAY SEASON**

Police are asking people to be aware of what's happening around them, and to report any suspicious behaviour directly to them.

Dial 111 immediately if you see someone breaking into a car or house. The sooner Police are made aware of the incident, the sooner they can respond.

A few simple actions can make your home and other property is safe and secure, especially if you are going away.

- Lock your car and garage
- Keep doors locked even when at home
- Close windows at night
- Keep your spare key in a safe place

Christmas is a tough time for many people with food and money being stretched even further.

Re church will be doing their final food parcel deliveries on the 15<sup>th</sup> December and will start up again on the 12<sup>th</sup> January. Tenants who receive these parcels will receive a flyer in your letterbox advising you of the dates specific to your complex.

Delta Trust closes on Friday 21<sup>st</sup> December and will re-open it's foodbank on Monday 7<sup>th</sup> January 2019.
